WRITING REPORTS

A Introduction

A report is the description of an event or a situation meant for a particular person or a group of persons. Reports about events, accidents, burglaries, matches, etc., are often published in newspapers. They are meant for their readers. Reports of events like the Annual Day, the Sports Day, etc., are published in school magazines. (Now newspapers also cover such events.) These reports are meant for the students and their parents. We also have students' progress reports, sales reports, etc. These reports are prepared for specific people.

B The features of a report

- The facts contained in the report must be correct.
- These facts should be given in proper order.
- If an event is being reported, it is important to mention the date and time of the event.
- Reports carry headings also.
- Reports carry the name of the writer also.
- Since a report is a formal piece of writing, it must contain only relevant details and should be formal in style.

1. Sheila Dikshit's Home Open to School Children
