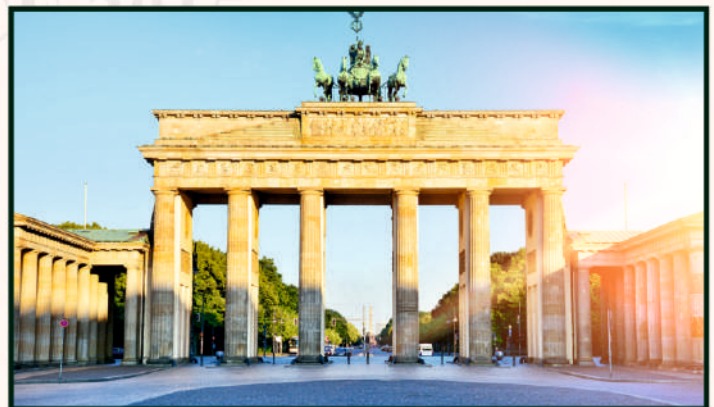

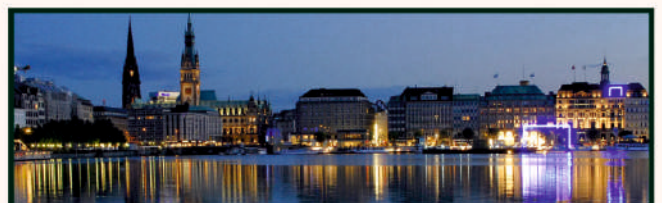
Learners will express opinions, narrate experiences, and manage most situations in German-speaking environments.

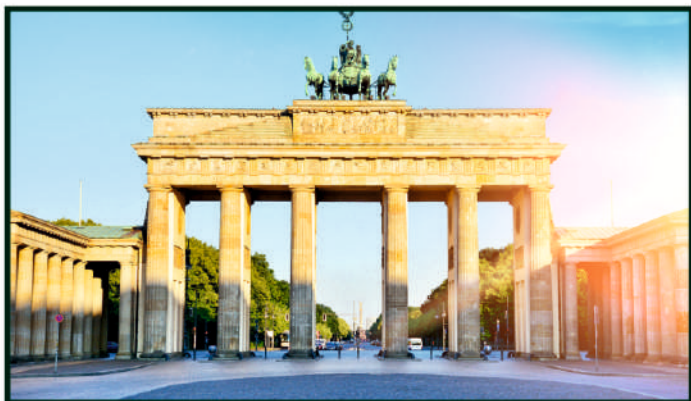
